

Nancy Jane's Self Watering Stacking Planters

Your set of planters includes: Three tiers of the Self Watering Planters, three grids, one tray and one hanging kit with swivel. (Hanging kit optional)

Hanging Instructions

The hanging kit includes one length of chain with a swivel, heavy duty slip ring and one chain locking disc.

(Step 1) Place one grid into each layer of pots, stack pots one on top of the other, turning each layer 120 degrees so that the bottom pot rests into the grooved area of the top pot. (Fig. 1)

(Step 2) Beginning with the top layer, drop the chain through all pots you wish to hang.

(Step 3) Under the bottom pot, slide the chain into the chain locking disc at least one link above its lowest point.

(Step 4) Pull chain up so that the disc rests in the notched area on the bottom of the pot. (Fig. 2)

(Step 5) Hold chain tight against top pot to keep pots together while installing tray. (Fig. 3)

(Step 6) Proceed to attach the drip tray by engaging the lugs and turning to lock into position. To remove tray, rotate tray counter-clockwise to release locking mechanism from bottom planter.

(Step 7) After installing a strong hook into a suitable location (e.g., rafter or beam), your stacking planters are ready to hang.

Note: Stacking Planters with soil and water can weigh up to 40 lbs. Ensure hook is adequate.

Fill each layer with soil, plant choice of seeds, bulbs, annuals, cacti, indoor arrangements, etc. Tend to plants per your individual plants' requirements.

Handy Hints

Water plants well. The patented design of the grids allow the soil to rest into the tubes which allow the soil to naturally wick the moisture up between watering to help prevent the soil from drying out. The water reservoir is refreshed each time you water. Our new design allows excess water to flow through the entire stack.

These planters can be stacked up to 10 layers high. The insertion of a metal dowel through the center of the pots and inserted 12" into the ground will hold the units stable against wind, pets and small children. This is great for tall strawberry or herb gardens or very effective as a point of interest in your flower garden!

The use of a kitchen trash bag over the container once it is planted will act as a hothouse and encourage seed development. Once seeds are sprouted, remove trash bag and grow as normal.

Keep herbs trimmed back and if plants begin to outgrow their planting area, simply insert a small shovel into the back of the growing area. Lift entire plant and roots from container. Break in half. Repot half of herb plant back into the planter and enjoy giving someone a fresh herb gift.

Rotate your pots regularly to keep an even light distribution and encourage equal foliage.

Should you desire not to utilize the self watering feature and wish to have more drainage holes, simply poke out the half-holes on the bottom of the pots and do not use the grids. Cacti and other dry loving plants will thrive. This method is also perfect for hydroponics gardening. A quick visit to a hydroponics store can get you set up with everything you need to start your very own indoor hydroponics garden!
